President

Vice President

- Charles has had a couple faculty meetings since the last council meeting
- High level future direction theoretical planning: new research tower
- Strategic plan for 2025 is getting settled
- Graduate studies faculty council funding has changed; most newly entering MSc student funding will be cut by 1500; 8.0 to 9.0 GPA required for future funding;
 - Had a meeting with the Vice Dean; university central administration made this decision without faculty or student involvement in the decision;
 - o The money is being reallocated to PhD students so they get guaranteed funding;
 - Charles argued against this decision at the meetings; facultγ has been helpful in supporting this stance
 - o Vice Dean has agreed to have a meeting with vice provost dean.

Vice President, Academic Affairs

- Reached out to OCSEB President Mary Scott for workshops
- Initially was going to plan a tutorial for intro to EPI but there was some difficulty in cooperating with faculty
- CSEB relationship has been established for future potential events
- Established a relationship with CMM VP Academics for future workshops about scholarship applications; thinking/planning about a workshop for scholarship application these days
 - Council members asked to reach out to Irina & Baies about being on a panel Zaina & Sebastian volunteered
 - Shannon recommended reaching out to people who have previously received the award + to contact professors to be on the panel
 - Charles suggested offering a peer-review service as this maybe the most effective use of time;
 students could bring in their drafts to get feedback from the panel
 - O Zobaida: CSEB did something similar like a peer-review process so she's wondering if we could do it in a more structured way by having upper-γears do the review process rather than peers who may be first γears and not be very knowledgeable on the process

Vice President, Wellness

- Collaborating a lot with CMM and BMI reps
- Working closelγ with Sam & Dilan
- Most recent wellness event: γoga night
 - o It went really well; people who attended enjoyed it
 - Kylie who is a yoga therapist and is willing to continue to support students on a continual basis.
 Could discuss the finances.
- The next wellness is being organized by BMI on October 30th.
 - Halloween trivia night planned for next Friday.
- CMM will be doing the main event for November, but have not yet planned it so more info yet to come.
- SEPHGSA will take over the December month events
- Some ideas for the new γear will be brought up next council meeting
- Nadine sent an email about a pilot project: "academic GPS" virtual study space with peers and moderator. A type of online mentoring/buddy system.

Vice President, Web Design

- Getting the SEPHGSA website up and running
 - Working with other SEPHGSA members to put resources up onto the website so that current and future students can access information that is difficult to find on the SEPH website
 - Resources include contact information for each of the SEPHGSA members and also blogs!
- Editing blog drafts sent by SEPHGSA members and mounting them onto a Google drive.
 - o Blogs range in terms of topic and cover funding, working in grad school, differences between the MPH and MSc Epi programs, self-care/wellness in grad school, etc.
 - The following link was shared in the meeting with all members, who were encouraged to look through all of the blogs and to verify content (i.e., ensure information seems to be correct in

- In particular, now that we have some SEPHGSA members who are familiar with the MPH program, perhaps we can add more blog content targeted to students from that program.
- Creating sticker designs to be sold to SEPH students. Sebastian and Samantha have both been working on these, and they shared 5 or 6 designs in the meeting. The designs were well received.
 - o Charles suggested that perhaps they should also make a sticker with the SEPHGSA logo on it.
 - We will hear more about the stickers soon and will be given the opportunity to vote on designs that will eventually be offered for purchase by SEPH students.
 - Stickers are quite inexpensive for SEPHGSA to purchase as well.

Vice President, Equity, Diversity & Inclusion

- EDI Student Committee Meeting on October 9th
 - o Ran out of time to discuss all items of interest will extend future meets past 60 minutes
- Hiring practices at the school
 - Faculty of Medicine Hiring and Retention Policy: Zahra provided her highlights and feedback on the document, although she also indicated that the makers of the document were not receptive on getting feedback
 - One of the critiques of the document is centered in on its use of vague language in directives that are extremely important and should be elaborated on further (e.g., "adequate effort or attempt should be made [to ensure fairness in hiring practices as it relates to equity, diversity and inclusion]..."). Zahra stressed that hiring is an important issue for the Faculty to get right as we are supposed to be hiring a couple of new faculty members at SEPH in the near future.
 - Hiring committees should be diverse and ideally should allow students to provide input on candidates for positions at the Faculty.
- Changes to funding at the Faculty of Medicine
 - Graduate Studies Scholarship is being replaced by the Admissions Scholarship, which will be
 offered for 1 year to MSc students and will not be renewable for a second year
 - Admissions Scholarship will not be available to students in the MPH program; it is not γet clear whether SEPH will be required to commit matching funds to students with the Admissions Scholarship)
 - Funding will look different for Masters and PhD students at SEPH going forward, and we need to understand how this will impact our students.
 - Vivian Welch will be sitting as the co-chair of the EDI Committee. Zahra and Vivian communicated about the appropriateness of sending out a survey to students (and ideally faculty) to gauge what funding for students is like. This survey did not get sent out during the pandemic but should be sent out.
 - Zahra received a copγ of the 2018 Student Satisfaction Survey and has data for 55 SEPH students who responded to that survey. Key findings: (a) 80% of respondents reported that they had the admission or excellence scholarship (evidently, many students rely on funding of this type, and the approaching changes to funding at the graduate level for SEPH students may

- very well negatively affect most of our student funding) (b) 67% of respondents reported that they did not have external funding (while the effects of changes to funding provided by the School may be downplayed using the excuse that many students have external funding, this survey indicates otherwise) (c) over 50% of respondents cited their primary concern at the School as being financial in nature.
- Should gauge what the financial situation is like for our students this year using a survey. We
 especially need to know what things are like for the MPH students, as their tuition is quite high
 and they will not be able to receive the Admission Scholarship of \$7500 in their first year
- Zahra will distribute the copγ of the financial survey Beth made last year and will consolidate the questions into a new version that can be distributed to students and possibly faculty.
- The school has funding for a seminar series.
- Can the GSA take up an advocacγ stance and act on issues as a group?
 - Charles would be happy to have SEPHGSA take on more of an advocacy role on these issues. However, as a cautionary note, we need to be aware that if we start having an advocacy voice, we need to be consistent/ We need to make sure we have an ear to the ground on what the pertinent issues are and keep on top of those concerns. Perhaps a working group could be in charge of keeping on top of those issues and writing stances that we can disseminate through social media.
- Zahra will organize another EDI working group meeting
 - o All members we are free to join in on their Zoom call
 - o The meeting is conversation based.
 - If we want Zahra to share the results of the Student Satisfaction Survey to the broader group, she's happy to do that. She also invited people to provide perspectives on the survey.

- MPH reps: Amy asked if there is a portal for students in SEPH programs to anonymously submit feedback to the SEPHGSA.
 - Currently there is no formal anonymous process to do this, but that we are happy to present issues that arise from a student concern anonymously (and of course representatives are key in this role).
 - Sebastian added that he could ensure an anonymous online feedback channel is added to the SEPHGSA website. On the page, we could write "Anonymously send questions to the SEPHGSA here". Sebastian indicated that he can make it so that a student does not have to associate a name with a comment.
